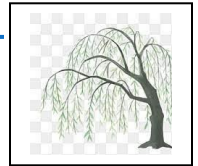


MAPLE CLASS



This week in Maple Class we have been continuing with our "Castles and Fairy tales" topic. We have written our own fairy tales, added to "Castle Classroom" and explored different materials to build houses for the Three Little Pigs. As part of our science experiments we have been getting very hands-on and had to fashion safety suits to protect our water balloons from bursting. In our math's Reception have been looking at mass, Year 1 have been counting within 20, Year 2 have been making equal groups. We also earned enough Dojo points to be able to look forward to our next prize, which will be a games afternoon

WILLOW CLASS



We critically discussed and further explored this terms topic which is 'What do we mean by truth?' The children took part in different group activities to talk about the difference between opinion, belief and truth.

Willow class have linked their Roman topic with literacy and other areas exploring Pompeii, Volcanoes and have explored Roman pottery. We have been creating a Roman dance, thinking about what gladiators were like at that time and improved on this as a result of constructive advice from our peers. In math's, we have looked at multiplication and division and are now on a new unit – measurement. We have had a great half term so far with lots of learning!

ASH CLASS



Ash Class have been continuing with their Roman themed work this week, we have looked at the development of roads and towns after the invasion. In English we have been developing characters for our longer writing piece starting next week. In math's the Year 6 pupils have just completed work on Ratio and Year 5 multiplying fractions.
