GRESHAM'S DYSON BUILDING (STEAM) TRIP

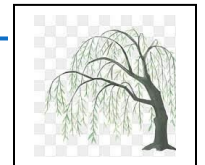
The children from Year 6 will be visiting Gresham's on Tuesday 21st May. Letters have been sent home.
